HISTORY OF ST. MARGARET PARISH AND ST. MARY MAGDALEN MISSION

November 19, 1900, Rev. J. Alphonse Frederick, the first pastor of St. Margaret Parish, purchased three acres of land in Bel Air, Maryland for the sum of \$3000, using money which was bequeathed to him by his mother, Anna Margaret (Hild) Frederick. Five years later, this land became the location of the church of Saint Margaret.

- Following are some facts and significant events in the history of St. Margaret Catholic Parish, and the development of St. Mary Magdalen Mission as a mission of St. Margaret.
- Rev. J. Alphonse Frederick was ordained a priest, December 18, 1874.
- On May 1, 1905 the cornerstone was laid and volunteers helped build the church. The Church was named in honor of Fr. Frederick's mother's patron saint, St. Margaret, a 3rd Century martyr. Mass was first celebrated on October 1, 1905. This was the first known celebration of a Catholic Mass in Bel Air. The original church, presently our Adult Education Center, was used for Eucharistic celebration until 1969 when the new church was finished.
- A Mass of dedication was celebrated on April 20, 1969, by His Eminence Lawrence Cardinal Shehan to consecrate the present house of worship for the Church of St. Margaret.
- The altar is a five ton piece of marble carved in the shape of a table. Within the altar is the relic of Pignatianus, a holy Roman martyr of the third century. The tabernacle of the Blessed Sacrament is located in the Chapel at the rear of the Church.
- The original church was remodeled to provide offices for the staff of St. Margaret until 1995 when the new two story building was completed. The new building now provides staff offices on the second floor and Pre-school and Kindergarten facilities on the first floor.
- The original church, now the Adult Education Center, was dedicated on May 13, 1995 by William Cardinal Keeler. It also houses the Archbishop William D. Borders Library which was dedicated in the Fall of 1995.

- On May 13, 1995, ground was broken for the new St. Mary Magdalen Mission Center on Churchville Road, which is the mission of St. Margaret. It was dedicated on April 12, 1997 by William Cardinal Keeler. A single multi-purpose building seats 600 for Mass and 300 for banquets. The complex also includes an Education Center/St. Margaret Middle School which was completed in the Spring of 2001.
- On September 20, 2001 the St. Mary Magdalen Education Center was dedicated by Bishop William C. Newman, Eastern Vicar of the Archdiocese of Baltimore. The Education Center consists of nine classrooms, a library/multimedia center and a gymnasium. The building houses St. Margaret Middle School (grades 6-8) during the day and Faith Formation and Continuing Education classes at other times.





RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults)

Bereavement Ministry

Funeral Sacristans

Our team supports families during the funeral Mass. Team members greet family members, set up and serve at the funeral Mass. Individuals are on call one week a month.

Funeral Reception Ministry

Provides hosting and set-up of hospitality after the funeral in the Adult Education Center.

Ministry of Consolation

This ministry provides spiritual and moral support for those who have suffered a loss. The group reaches out to the family members through cards and calls following the funeral services. They also plan the annual All Souls Mass and a reception afterward.

Funeral Liturgy Planning

Priests and deacons meet with families to complete the Introductory Rites, Liturgy of the Word to include selected readings and hymns, Liturgy of the Eucharist, and individuals who will be involved. This preparation assures families that all aspects of the service will be handled with honor, dignity and meets the wishes of the deceased and their family. Widow and Widower

This group meets on the second Tuesday of each month for lunch and activities. Lead coordinator is Carol Hoffman.

Homeless / Poor

Saint Margaret works in a variety of ways to assist the homeless and poor in our area.

Cooperative Food Ministry

Five area churches feed the needy and the homeless in our area at Calvary Baptist Church, located at 206 Courtland Place. Every Monday night a different church arrives at 3:30 pm to prepare and serve 50-75 people dinner at 6:00 pm. We currently have two teams with lead coordinators, Janet Gentry and Steve Hunter.

Cottage Thrift Shop

A joint ministry of St. Margaret Parish and Emmanuel Episcopal Church. Volunteers collect, sort and assist in the shop, which provides clothing and miscellaneous articles to needy clients at a modest cost, or as a donation. Lead coordinator is Pat Stasiak.

FCCAU Welcome One Shelter

Provides year round transitional housing to homeless individuals. St. Margaret Parish volunteers on the 29th of each month.

Volunteers help cook and provide evening host or hostesses once a month. Lead coordinator is Darlene Eickhoff.

Habitat for Humanity Susquehanna

This group works with the non-profit ecumenical Christian housing ministry whose mission to eliminate sub-standard housing for economically disadvantaged families living in Harford County. 
